Keep in mind:

Diversity: Typically defined as the difference between people. It usually includes primary characteristics like race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, disability and age. It may also include secondary, socially acquired factors such as religion, marital status, geographic location, socioeconomic background, military status and educational experience.

Inclusion: Addresses the extent to which individuals are empowered to participate in organizational contexts. It requires the organization to value interactions with various groups, providing them with access to material resources, treating them equitably within institutional processes.
